Examples of work as a barrister

Advised and appeared for public and private clients on a broad spectrum of matters across the public law sphere in all Queensland Courts, including on appeal. These matters often involve complicated questions of law and, more frequently, involve the application of the *Human Rights Act* 2019 (Qld). Some recent examples include:

- Advised and appeared (led by Horton KC) for the former trustee of Queensland in the successful appeal against the Queensland Crime and Corruption Commission (CCC): Carne v Crime and Corruption Commission [2022] QCA 141. The matter has now been appealed, with myself and Mr Horton KC being briefed to respond to the Special Leave Application.
- Advised and appeared (led by Hindman KC) for the State of Queensland in an aspect of Judicial review proceedings challenging the Covid-19 'High-risk setting' directive. The matter involved extensive, conventional Judicial review grounds, including a constitutional aspect and a significant human rights component.
- Jointly advised (with Horton KC and A Hellewell) the Officer of Liquor and Gaming Regulation (OLGR) on discrete matters falling from the recent inquiry in the Star Casino operations in Queensland.
- Advised and appeared (unled) for a building certifier in a disciplinary matter in the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal.
- Regularly advised the State on matters of statutory construction, including:
 - proposed amendments to the *Environmental Protection Act* 1994 (Qld);

Advised and appeared for the State (as a prosecutor) and private clients in criminal matters (both summary and indictable) in all Queensland Courts. Joshua has significant experience in complex regulatory matters involving statutory offences and, in particular, involving environmental offences. While he appears in all criminal and quasi-criminal cases, his practice focuses on regulatory and white-collar crime matters. Recent examples include:

- Advised and appeared (led by Devlin KC and Keim SC) as a prosecutor for the Crown in a significant prosecution under the *Environmental Protection Act* 1994 (Qld) of four executive officers for indictable offences. This matter involved an extensive brief of evidence and many expert witnesses.
- Advised and appeared (unled) as prosecutor for Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) in a trial for 19 offences under the *Fire and Emergency Services Act* 1990 (Qld) and the *Building Fire Safety Regulation* 2008 (Qld).
- Advised and appeared (unled) for QFES as the respondent to a section 222 of the *Justices Act* 1886 (Qld) appeal against conviction in the District Court. This matter was advanced on the ground of apprehended bias. The respondent was successful in resisting the appeal.
- Advised a significant commercial restaurant operation on strategies to defend a development offence under the *Planning Act* 2016 (Qld).

Advised and appeared for private clients in civil disputes in all Queensland Courts. These matters involve contract disputes, planning and environment, property and land, corporate law, and torts. Recent examples include:

- Advised and appeared (unled) for the State of Queensland in a contested Supreme Court application for further and better particulars in relation to a malicious prosecution and misfeasance in public office suit against the State of Queensland and others.
- Jointly advised (led by de Jersey KC) on the application of ss 53 and 55 of the *Property Law Act* 1974 (Qld) to a 'give and take' agreement between two large pastoral landholders.
